Both the indoor/outdoor environments are incorporated to support optimal learning and development. Children explore and learn together alongside Early Learning professionals. Parents are welcome to stay and participate with their child or attend a parenting program. Fit for Life	A physical literacy program which builds on the fundamental skills of gross motor development, interactive snack preparation, hands on activities, and offers parent resources; all working together to build lifelong healthy lifestyle choices. *younger siblings from birth to two are welcome to attend*	2 – 6 years
Growing Healthy Together	This program is for pregnant women needing support. The group will learn about having a healthy pregnancy, including healthy eating, get tips on cooking and meal preparation, meet other women, share questions and concerns about their pregnancy and prepare for birth and their new baby. Infant Massage (EO)	Building a strong attachment with your infant is one of the building blocks to social development. This program is a great way to build this attachment while learning techniques for stimulating, relaxing and providing relief for your infant. Make the Connection 1-2 years (CCB program)	Make the Connection 1-2 years, incorporates hands-on parent-child activities, videotaping and discussions to help parents reflect on key components of secure attachment. This secure beginning sets in motion a positive course for a child’s social and emotional well-being, learning in school and contribution to society. **Limited Sibling Program available for children Birth-6 years	12 months to 24 months
Mother Connection	This program is for mothers of children from birth to 5 years of age with Down Syndrome. The workshop facilitator will provide information, support and resources to the group.
